1. Basic information

blizznet Managed WLAN is an add-on product offered by Wien Energie (hereinafter WE) to business customers as defined by Article 1 of the Austrian Consumer Protection Act (*KSchG*). The provision of services is based on the general terms and conditions (*AGB*) relating to blizznet products, the blizznet service level agreement (blizznet SLA) and these blizznet Managed WLAN specifications and remuneration terms, which can be accessed (in German) at www.wienenergie/agb.

blizznet Managed WLAN offers business internet customers a comprehensive, centrally managed solution for complete and stable WLAN coverage in buildings or over large areas. Strategically located access points (AP) and continuous monitoring ensure a high level of network performance and reliability. This service encompasses the provision, configuration, monitoring and maintenance of the network infrastructure provided by Wien Energie.

2. Specifications

The contractual arrangement relating to blizznet Managed WLAN is exclusively between WE and the respective customer. As an add-on product, blizznet Managed WLAN cannot be sourced independently and is only available as an add on to blizznet business internet products.

blizznet Managed WLAN refers to a solution for providing and establishing a wireless network covering an entire area, such as an office building. The aim is to provide reliable and complete WLAN coverage in all areas. WLAN illumination, an additional analysis service provided subject to additional charges, makes it possible to identify those strategic locations where access points need to be installed in order to ensure a stable, high-performance connection throughout the entire area.

This service encompasses not only the installation of the hardware, such as routers and access points, but also the ongoing monitoring of network stability. Regular updates are also performed in addition in order to guarantee the up-to-date status of device firmware.

2.1 Description of services

In the context of the existing premises and building-specific circumstances, as well as the technical options available at the customer's premises, blizznet Managed WLAN includes the following services:

2.1.1 Planning and design

- **Site analysis and network design:** The performance of a chargeable WLAN illumination analysis to determine the optimal number and placement of the APs, including the technical feasibility in the course of an on-site inspection. The customer subsequently receives a detailed report with regard to the network design.

2.1.2 Provision of hardware

- **Access points (APs):** Enterprise APs to cover the entire area (indoor and outdoor areas).
- **Router:** The central network device for forwarding data packets between networks.
- **Controller:** The central control unit for managing the APs
- **Switches:** Network switches in order to integrate the WLAN infrastructure into the customer network.

2.1.3 Installation and configuration

- **Installation:** Physical installation of the APs, router, controller and switches based on the findings of the WLAN illumination analysis.
- **Configuration:** Setup of the WLAN networks.

2.1.4 Features

- **Encryption:** Implementation of WPA2/3 encryption to safeguard wireless communication.
- **Basic firewall setup:** to prevent incoming access. (customer-specific modifications are possible, subject to agreement with WE)
- Installation of WLAN access for guests if required.
- Read access to the controller (full access possible, subject to agreement with WE)

blizznet Managed WLAN is available based on the following tariffs (plans):

²⁾ This tariff relates to a customizable solution which is only implemented as a project.

2.2 Minimum contract term

In as far as no other minimum contract term has been agreed, a minimum contract term of 24 months shall apply. In the event of the remaining minimum contract term for the blizznet business internet primary connection being shorter than the agreed minimum contract defined herein at the time of concluding the blizznet Managed WLAN contract (add-on), the minimum contract terms of the blizznet business internet shall be extended to coincide with the end of the minimum contract term of the blizznet Managed WLAN contract (add-on) concluded. In the case of small and micro enterprises, as defined by Article 4 (66) of the Austrian Telecommunications Act (*TKG 2021*), and non-profit organizations, this extension shall apply only in as far the ordering process effectively waives the application of the provisions defined by Article 136 (1) and (3) of the *TKG 2021* legislation.

In as far as there is no effective waiving of these rights during the ordering process, a minimum contract term of 12 months shall apply in the case of small and micro enterprises, as defined by Article 4 (66) of the *TKG 2021* legislation, as well as for non-profit organizations. In such cases involving the termination of the contract after a term of less than 24 months, the customer shall be required to provide written evidence which establishes without doubt that they qualify as a small or micro enterprise, as defined by

Article 4 (66) of the *TKG 2021* legislation, or as a non-profit organization.

2.3 Preconditions

The use of blizznet business internet is a prerequisite for taking advantage of the blizznet Managed WLAN add-on.

A WLAN illumination analysis is a precondition for receiving blizznet Managed WLAN. This WLAN illumination analysis is provided by Wien Energie subject to a fee. This analysis determines the exact number of access points necessary as well as their optimal placement in order to ensure full network coverage. Building specifics are also evaluated in order to check the technical feasibility of implementation.

A power supply (230V, 16A max., 1Ph) is also required at the installation site of the central hardware components. This is to be provided by the customer. The WLAN access points are supplied with power via the central hardware components.

The customer is required to provide a current building and fire protection plan in order for the access point locations to be defined exactly. This acts as a basis for taking the specifics of the premises into account, for fire protection requirements and in order to avoid the installation of hardware in safety-critical areas (e.g. emergency exit routes, fire compartments, technical areas with special safety requirements). It is not possible to provide a commitment with regard to planning the positions of access points without these plans.

If, during the implementation of the project, it is determined that it is not possible to provide a standard solution due to technical or premise-specific issues, WE shall advise the customer of this without delay. In such a case, the customer shall have the option of requesting the product on a project basis subject to the blizznet Managed WLAN Solution tariff.

The provision and the smooth operation of the blizznet Managed WLAN service is subject to an available IPv4 address within the subnet allocated to the customer by WE. This must be made available to WE by the customer without restrictions for the entire duration of the contractual term and may not be used for or by other services or systems. This IPv4 address is a precondition for the successful implementation and fault-free operation of the service.

The customer shall be required to inform WE without delay, and in all cases before implementation, of any planned or actual later changes relating to construction, spatial or transmission issues relevant to the areas supplied with WLAN which could have an influence of WLAN coverage (in particular: the installation or removal of dividing walls, changes relating to furniture and fittings, such as metal shelving, the installation of large-scale machinery, the installation of additional wireless networks, significant changes to user/device density, sources of electromagnetic disruption). The customer shall itself refrain from making any changes to the network design and the relocation/modification of components installed by WE. Changes to the premises can have an impact on the WLAN performance originally documented.

3. Remuneration terms

All amounts set out here are exclusive of VAT.

3.1 Monthly fees

The following monthly fees will be charged based on the blizznet Managed WLAN tariff selected: The monthly fee is made up of a fixed fee plus an additional fee for access points (AP). The latter varies depending on the number of access points required.

The blizznet Managed WLAN Standard tariff provides the customer with the Basic Option (WiFi 6) for indoor access points. The blizznet Managed WLAN Advanced and Solution tariffs provide the customer with two different options for indoor access points based on the selection of the Basic Option (WiFi 6) and the Performance Option (WiFi 7). The blizznet Managed WLAN Solution tariff allows the customer to select the option of outdoor access points.

- ¹⁾ Basic Option: The Basic Option entails the provision of WLAN based on 802.11AX/WiFi 6.
- ²⁾ Performance Option: The Performance Option entails the provision of WLAN based on 802.11BE/WiFi 7. This option is only available in connection with the tariffs blizznet Managed WLAN Advanced and Solution.
- ³⁾ Outdoor access point: This option is only available in connection with the blizznet Managed WLAN Solution tariff.

Note: It is not permitted to combine the indoor access point options in connection with the blizznet Managed WLAN Advanced and blizznet Managed WLAN Solution tariffs. Only one blizznet Managed WLAN tariff is available per customer site.

3.2 Set-up fees

A one-time set-up fee will be charged based on the blizznet Managed WLAN tariff selected. This set-up fee covers the costs incurred (travel, set-up, installation and configuration of the Managed WLAN solution and the documentation provided by WE). The set-up fee is based on the specific circumstances at the customer site. The final set-up fee can be calculated and offered to the customer after an on-site inspection.

Note: The installation of the tertiary cabling between the WE customer premises equipment (CPE) and the access points is included in the setup fee. Repairs and any maintenance work related to the tertiary cabling remains the customer’s responsibility.

3.3 Other fees

A WLAN illumination analysis and an on-site inspection of the premises take place prior to the final implementation in order to determine the exact number of APs and their ideal positioning. This is key to ensuring reliable, high-performance WLAN coverage and the technical feasibility of the project (refer to Section 2.1.1).

The WLAN illumination analysis is necessary for the implementation of blizznet Managed WLAN products. The WLAN illumination analysis service can be commissioned separately without any commitment to implement a blizznet Managed WLAN product.

The following one-time fee will be charged for the WLAN illumination analysis. This fee includes an illumination analysis of up to 24 access points. Following an on-site inspection, an offer can be provided to the customer for the WLAN illumination solution option. This tariff is charged for over 25 access points or in the case of customized solutions.

Note:

The findings of the WLAN illumination analysis relate solely to the circumstances pertaining to the premises and the transmission realities prevailing at the time of the analysis. Any subsequent changes with regard to the environment – particularly with regard to the addition or removal of installations (e.g. metal shelving), dividing walls or other construction features, the installation of large-scale machinery, significant changes to the density of users/devices and external sources of transmission disruption (e.g. additional transmission networks, electromagnetic interference) – can have a significant impact on WLAN performance and lead to deviations from the documented findings of the analysis. WE shall accept no responsibility for deviations in performance which are solely attributable to such subsequent changes or external sources of signal disruption. In such cases, a further WLAN illumination analysis will be required in order to restore WLAN coverage taking into account the new circumstances. This subsequent WLAN illumination analysis will be invoiced in accordance with the applicable valid remuneration terms as a separate service.

4. Service management & SLA

The standard valid performance criteria of WE are set out in the service level agreement (SLA). These specifications define the points which are specific to the blizznet Managed WLAN product.

A differentiation is made between wireless and cable-based connections. Wireless connections (WLAN) and access points are excluded from any service level agreements (SLA). Any efforts to address/resolve disruptions are based on the best-effort principle. The SLAs selected in connection with the blizznet business internet package apply to cable-based connections and network infrastructure.

In the event of a disruption which requires the exchange of hardware components, these shall be exchanged free-of-charge by WE within a few working days during the minimum contractual period. Any end devices not provided by WE and the tertiary cabling between the WE CPE and the access points are excluded from service management.

5. Termination

Any termination of the contract relating to the blizznet business internet product shall automatically entail a termination of the blizznet Managed WLAN contract.

Any termination of the contract relating to the blizznet Managed WLAN contract shall not automatically entail a termination of the blizznet business internet product.

Upon termination of the contract and the settlement of all payment obligations by the customer, the hardware provided shall transfer to customer ownership. Until this point in time, the hardware shall remain the property of WE. In the event of a termination prior to the minimum contract term expiring, the

customer shall be required to pay the residual monthly fees payable for the period from the actual termination until the end of the minimum contract term. No residual fees shall be payable in the event of the contract being terminated for cause on the part of the customer (refer to Section 9.3 of the blizznet general terms and conditions [AGB]).
